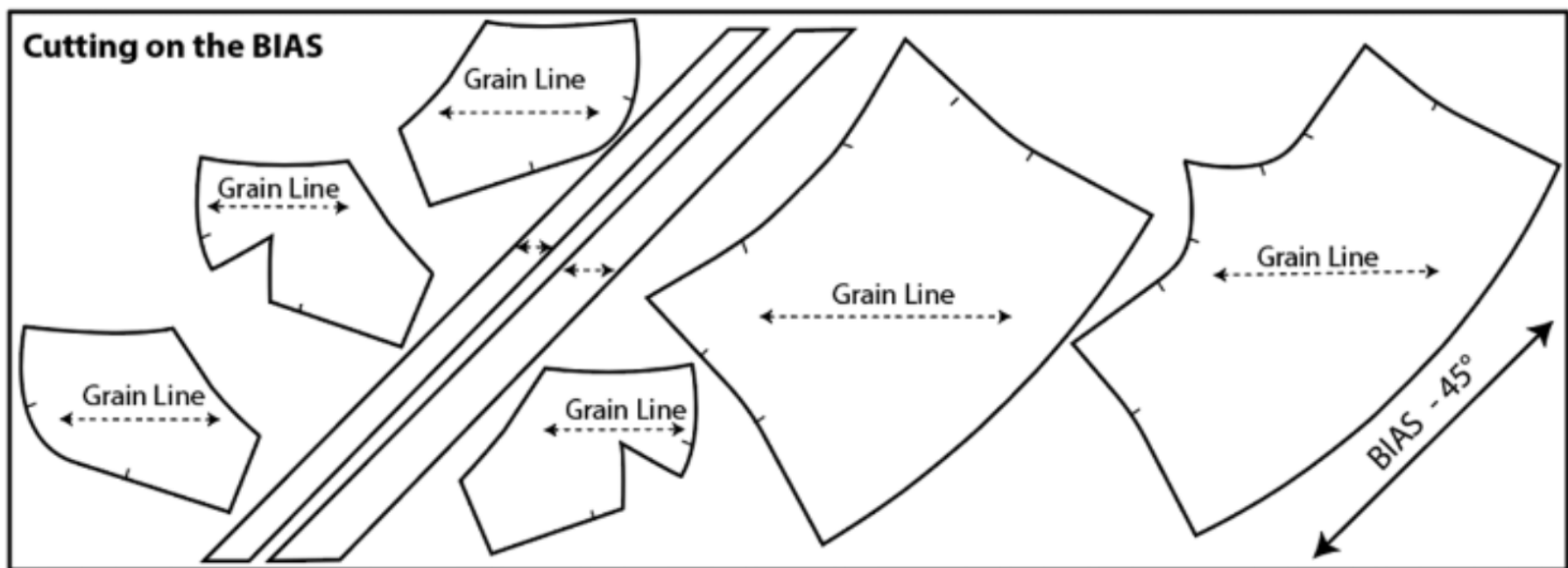

Front Rise / Back Rise

1. French Seam the front rise.
1.A. Pin wrong sides together, lock stitch with 5mm Seam Allowance.
1.B. Trim 2-3mm Seam allowance with small sharp scissors.
1.C. Pin right sides together, lock stitch with 5mm Seam Allowance.
2. Repeat for back rise.
3. Press (Iron) front and back rise seams towards the Left to avoid thickness at crotch.
